THE WEBBER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

- The Webber Family Scholarship consists of a payment of \$1,000 and is accompanied by a certificate with citation.
- One scholarship will be awarded each year.
- The scholarship will be awarded following receipt of written applications and interviews of shortlisted applicants.
- Previous recipients are not eligible to apply in subsequent years.

CRITERIA

Applicants should:

- a. be a Year 9 or Year 10 student of Melbourne High School;
- b. be undertaking STEM-related subjects;
- c. have excellent academic results in their high school studies; and
- d. demonstrate involvement in the broader aspects of student and community life

Consideration will be given to applicants who can demonstrate financial hardship.
