


THE GUPTA FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

ABOUT GORO GUPTA

In 1990, the Gupta family arrived in Australia with courage in their hearts and three powerful dreams:

- 1. To own property in their new homeland
- 2. To educate their children through university
- 3. To build a business from the ground up



By 1998, while still in Year 10 at Melbourne High School (Class of 2000), Goro Gupta launched his first business. Fuelled by grit and ambition, he grew it into the largest of its kind in Australia by 2006, before exiting successfully.

Over the past 20 years, Goro has also trained with and worked alongside some of the world's most influential thought leaders—serving as a senior leader with Tony Robbins, where he has mentored others while continuing to learn from the best of the best in human performance, business mastery, and personal growth.

Today, Goro is the founder of three purpose-driven companies, including one of the top 10 NDIS Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) providers in the country. His companies are built on a foundation of ethical investing, social impact, and sustainable wealth creation—delivering safe, inclusive housing for Australians with disabilities and pioneering co-living models to address the rental crisis.

The Gupta Family Scholarship exists to support the next generation of values-driven leaders—those who believe that business can be a force for good, and that no dream is out of reach when matched with vision, effort, and heart.

- The Gupta Family Scholarship consists of a payment of \$1,000
- Goro will offer monthly mentoring sessions for a period of 6 months
- The Award is accompanied by a certificate with citation
- One Scholarship is awarded each year
- The Scholarship is awarded following receipt of written applications and interviews of shortlisted applicants
- Previous recipients are not eligible to apply in subsequent years.

- b. demonstrate that they have successfully started up their own business and are making a profit beyond sales to family and friends.
